

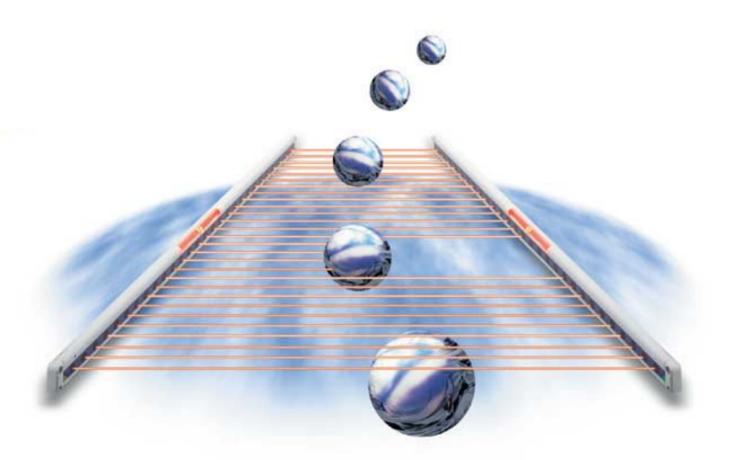

The NA2-N series offers incredibly high performance in a general purpose area sensor.

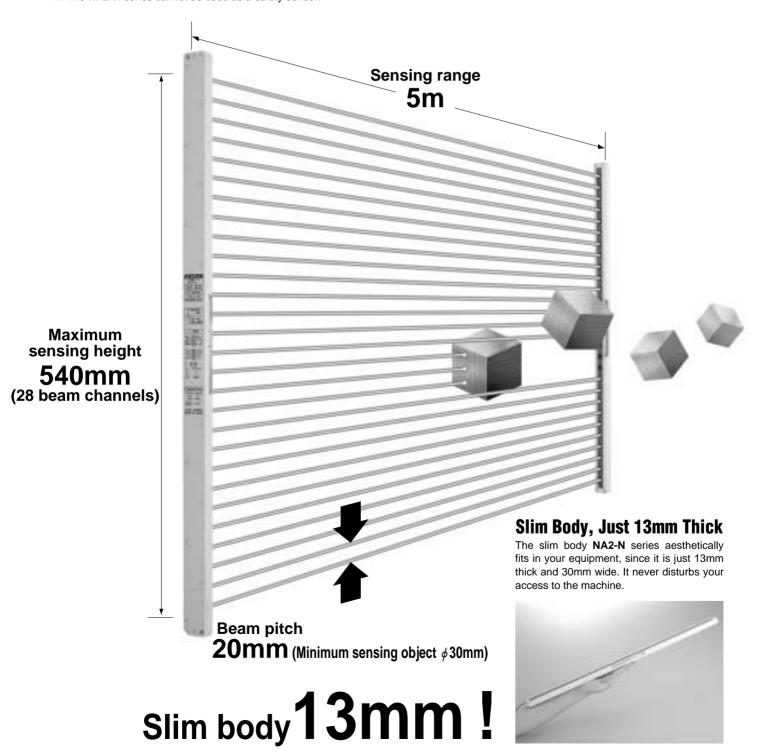
The slim body, just 13mm thick and 30mm wide, can be installed almost anywhere, greatly increasing planning efficiency.

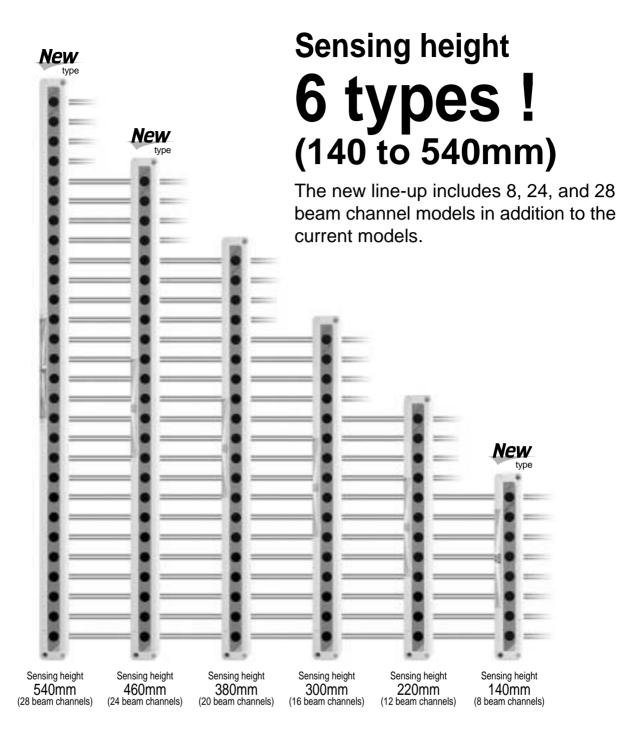
With a wide range of thin resin case type area sensors, from sensing height at 540mm (28 beam channels) down to 140mm (8 beam channels), you can choose the size that best suits your purpose.

In order to meet global market standards, these sensors conform to the CE marking EMC Directive and are currently undergoing UL Recognition certification. In addition to this, a PNP output type, which is in high demand in Europe, is also available.

This general purpose & slim body area sensor is the answer to all of your on-site needs.

* The NA2-N series cannot be used as a safety sensor.

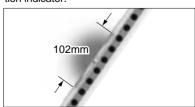




Clearly Visible Wide Job Indicator

Both the receiver and the emitter feature job indicators, 102mm wide, which use red bright LEDs.

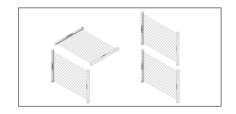
When the sensing output and the job indicator input are connected, the job indicator can be used as a large size operation indicator.

Setting different emission frequencies for two sensors prevents mutual interference. Use of two sensors together covers a wider detection area

The set frequencies can be identified by the number of emitting indicators which light up.



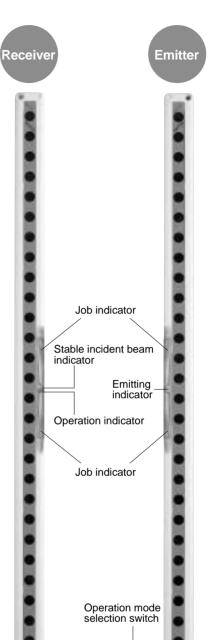

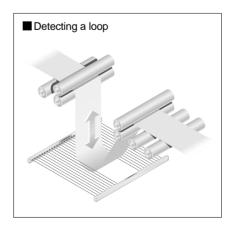


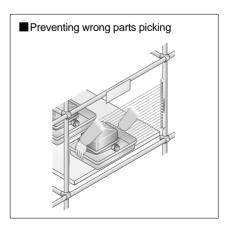
Applications

Slit mask

The slit mask restricts the amount of beam emitted or received and is used to reduce interference between neighboring sensors. It is also used if the light is so

It is also used if the light is so strong that it passes through the object.

Remove the cover (metal plate) from the front of the sensor and replace it with the slit mask.
The sensing range is reduced when the slit mask is used.

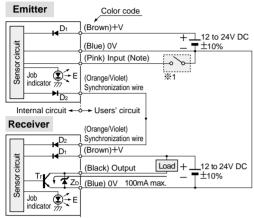

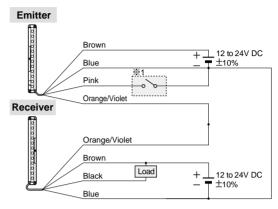

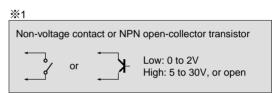

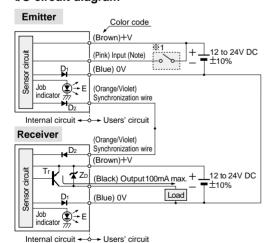

Wiring diagram



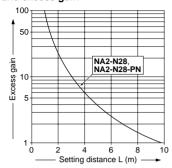

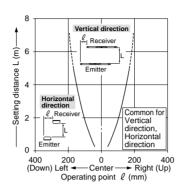

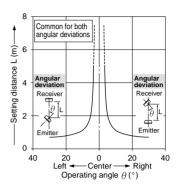
Correlation between setting distance and excess gain

Angular deviation (All models)

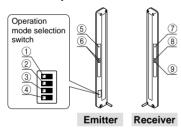

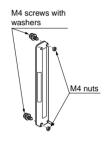

Mounting

 Use M4 screws with washers and M4 nuts. The tightening torque should be 0.5N·m or less. During mounting, do not apply any bending or twisting force to the sensor.

Please arrange the screws and nuts separately.

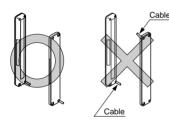
 The job indicators can be used as large operation indicators by setting No.4 of the operation mode switch to the OFF side and connecting the input (pink) of the emitter to the output (black) of the receiver.

Orientation

• The emitter and the receiver must face each other correctly. If they are set upside down, the sensor does not work.



Test-run function

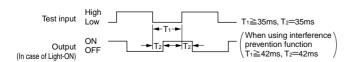
 The emission is stopped when No.4 of the operation mode switch is set to the ON side and the input (pink) of the emitter is made High (PNP output type: Low).

Since the output can be turned ON/OFF without the sensing object, this function is useful for start-up inspection. If the output follows the application/withdrawal of the test input, the sensor operation is normal, else it is abnormal.

Time chart



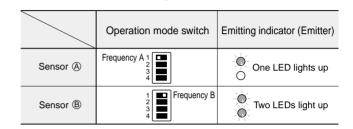

Interference prevention function

 By setting different emission frequencies, two units of NA2-N series can be mounted close together, as shown in the figure below. The emission frequency can be checked by the number of LEDs lighting up in the emitting indicator on the emitter

Wiring

- Make sure to carry out the wiring in the power supply off condition
- Verify that the supply voltage variation is within the rating.
- If power is supplied from a commercial switching regulator, ensure that the frame ground (F.G.) terminal of the power supply is connected to an actual ground.
- In case noise generating equipment (switching regulator, inverter motor, etc.) is used in the vicinity of this sensor, connect the frame ground. (F.G.) terminal of the equipment to an actual ground.
- Do not run the wires together with high-voltage lines or power lines or put them in the same raceway. This can cause malfunction due to induction.

Others

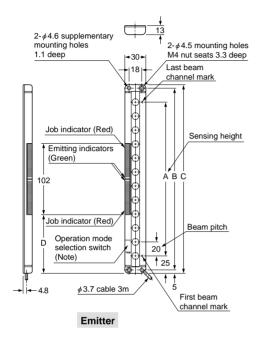
- Do not use during the initial transient time (500ms) after the power supply is switched on.
- Avoid dust, dirt and steam.
- Take care that the sensor does not come in direct contact with water, oil, grease, or organic solvents, such as, thinner, etc.
- Take care that the sensor is not directly exposed to fluorescent light from a rapid-starter lamp or a high frequency lighting device, as it may affect the sensing performance.

NA2 series (previous model slim body area sensor) Replacement

• The new NA2-N series just released is the successor to our previous series of slim body area sensors, the NA2 series. While the specifications and external dimensions are virtually the same, the NA2-N series and the NA2 series are not compatible. (The receiver and emitter are both new products and cannot be used with earlier versions of these products. Further, if the new model is used in combination with the previous model, the interference prevention function will also not work.)
Because production of the NA2 series will be discontinued in the future, we suggest that you consider moving up to our new NA2-N series.

Changes

- Addition of 8, 24 and 28 beam channel models and PNP output model to existing range of models.
- The Test-run Function has been redesigned.
- Power indicators have been replaced with Emitting indicators, and the lighting patterns have changed accordingly.
- As the Test-run Function has been redesigned, indicator lighting patterns and operation mode selection switch settings have changed accordingly.
- Enclosure color has slightly changed.

There are no further changes other than those listed above.
